



AI Memory Hygiene for Authors

Stop Your Chatbot "Forgetting" Mid-Project

AI chat tools are brilliant at helping with plotting, drafting, and book marketing - right up until they "forget" your rules, flatten your voice, or contradict your own series bible.

This checklist gives you a simple "memory hygiene" routine so your AI stays sharp, on-voice, and on-brief.

1. Before You Start a New Project

- Define the project goal in one sentence
- Write a short description of your ideal reader
- Grab a sample of your own writing (1-3 paragraphs) that shows your voice
- List your key constraints (genre rules, content boundaries, platforms, budget, deadlines)
- Highlight any canon the AI must respect (series bible points, world rules, recurring characters)

2. Create a Strong Opening Brief

- "Here's the project goal and what success looks like."
- "Here's my ideal reader and what they want from this book/business."
- "Here's a short sample of my writing - please match this style."
- "Here are the rules and constraints you must follow."
- "Here are the key facts about my world/series/brand you must not break."

3. Healthy Chat Habits

- One clear purpose per chat (plotting OR emails, not everything at once)
- When you change topic, start a new chat instead of continuing the old one
- If replies start to feel generic, repetitive, or contradictory, pause and reset
- Aim to reset around every 15-20 meaningful messages



4. How to Reset a Messy Chat

Before ending a long conversation, ask the AI:

- "Summarise this project in under 400 words: goal, key decisions, constraints, voice notes."
- "List the rules and non-negotiables we've agreed so far."

Then, in a new chat:

- Paste that summary as your opening message
- Add any corrections or clarifications if needed
- Continue the work from there with a clean slate

5. External Memory (Your Source of Truth)

- Keep your series bible in a document or Notion, not buried in chat history
- Keep separate documents for "Author Brand Voice" and "Offers & Funnels"
- For each new chat, paste only the relevant excerpt instead of the whole document
- Update your bibles and voice docs when you make big decisions with AI

6. Quick Memory Checks

Drop these questions into longer conversations to catch problems early:

- "What genre and sub-genre are we working in, and what rules are we following?"
- "Describe my ideal reader in three bullet points."
- "List the top five constraints you are currently obeying on this project."
- "What have we already decided that you must not contradict?"
